
In compliance with section 65 (13) of the Constitution of Botswana, we hereby submit to you our report on the activities and processes leading to the preparation for and conduct of the 2009 General Elections held on the 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2009. This followed the dissolution of Parliament on the 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2009. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 2009, His Excellency the President issued a Writ of Election for each of the fifty-seven constituencies. He declared the 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2009 as nomination day and the 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2009 as polling day for the constituencies in which there was a contest.

In terms of section 154 (1) and 34 of the Electoral Act, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 2009 the Honourable Minister for Local Government issued 490 Election Instruments for the nomination and election of representatives of City/Town and District Councils. The instruments also designated the 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2009 and 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2009 as nomination day and polling day respectively.


In pursuance of such writs of elections and election instruments, a general election of the elected members of the National Assembly and the election of Council representatives to all the City/Town and District Councils were held simultaneously on the 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2009 throughout Botswana.

## **INTRODUCTION**

The Independent Electoral Commission (IEC) is mandated to manage the electoral process in the conduct of elections for the National Assembly and Local Government and provide civic and voter education to increase participation and turnout of the electorate at elections. In the mitigation of the challenges facing the Commission it undertook a number of activities that were intended to improve service delivery. The Commission used experiences and challenges from the 2004 General Elections to prepare for the 2009 General Elections.

The Commission increased its personnel at both Headquarters and the districts from 128 to 156 as a capacity building initiative. At Headquarters the Information Education Unit increased staff with the introduction of broadcasting officers to undertake civic and voter education activities. The outstations (district office) increased from twenty (20) to twenty-five (25) to take services closer to the general public. These offices represent the IEC in all matters relating to elections, including conducting civic and voter education.

One of the most significant developments during the period leading to the 2009 General Elections was the improvement of the legal framework. This was promulgated in terms of the Electoral (Amendment) Act, 2008; (No. 21 of 2008). The Amendment introduced among others, the separation of some activities of parliamentary and local government elections. It stipulates that the counting of votes for Parliamentary and Local Government shall be done at constituency and polling district headquarters respectively. These were effected during the 2009 General Elections. This separation of portfolio responsibilities resulted in the recruitment of a further four hundred and ninety (490) additional Returning Officers to man polling district headquarters. It was anticipated that this arrangement would facilitate the speedy release of results.

In pursuance of the IEC strategic objective of catering for people with special needs the Commission undertook the following major activities in preparation for the general elections;-

- Transcribed a text on electoral process into braille to cater for literate visually impaired.
- Developed a picture book to cater for illiterate voters.
- Developed a ballot paper template to cater for the visually impaired.
- The use of a sign language in the “IEC News” to cater for the hearing impaired.

Overall these initiatives seemed to have paid dividends judging from the achievements attained.

## **CIVIC AND VOTER EDUCATION**

In preparations for the 2009 General Elections, the IEC embarked upon various programmes and activities to educate and sensitise the electorate on the importance of participating in elections including voting. Civic and Voter education intensified from 2005 onwards after the acquisition of an Outside Broadcasting Van and the new full complement of the technical staff to operate it. Audio visual aides were incorporated into the civic and voter education programmes with the Outside Broadcasting Van being the main presentation platform.

The IEC continued building collaborative initiatives with key stakeholders such as the youth, women, faith sector, politicians, people living with disabilities and other civic organisations. Various strategies like Kgotsa meetings, workshops and seminars were used to discuss and share ideas on issues on election processes with the stakeholders. More emphasis was put on the youthful electorate, who were

singled out in the 2001 Voter Apathy Report as the group with the highest voter apathy prevalence. They currently comprise 60% of the total population.

In 2007, the Commission conducted six regional workshops to dialogue with youth on their lack of participation in the electoral process. The recommendations from these workshops were shared with other stakeholders and used to map out strategies including edutainment (education with entertainment), e.g. road shows to address the voter apathy. In particular roadshows were used in 2007 to mobilise the youth to register for the 2009 general elections. Voter education was also intensified in schools by visiting primary, secondary and tertiary level institutions to introduce and familiarise students with the importance of participating in the election process at an early stage.

Publicity materials printed with messages that encouraged people to take part in elections were produced. These were distributed during voter education activities in schools and workshops.

To address issues of the electorate with special needs, a picture book was developed to cater for the illiterate electorate; sign language infused in television programmes for the hearing impaired and some voter education content transcribed into Braille for the visually impaired. In addition to the Braille, a ballot paper template was designed to assist the visually impaired to vote in privacy in these elections. Feedback on how the template was received by the visually impaired voters is still awaited.

The IEC took advantage of all available media to reach out to all groups of the electorate. Posters were designed and distributed to encourage the electorate to register and vote in the General Elections. Billboards were also designed to publicise the General Elections.

A five (5) minute advertorial (IEC News) was launched and aired on BTV continuously for the duration of the elections publicity period including polling day. Its main aim was to keep the electorate informed about the activities of the IEC and to educate them on the details of the electoral processes. Other publicity campaign tools included public service pay slips printed with election messages.

Further to stakeholder consultation, the IEC undertook a tour of the country to address prospective candidates and their campaign managers for the 2009 General Elections to update them on its elections state of preparedness and acquaint them with the requirements of the law on nomination of candidates; polling and counting of votes and other critical electoral processes. A total of fifty-seven (57) meetings were held.

## **RECRUITMENT AND TRAINING OF POLL STAFF**

A total of Five Hundred and Fourty Seven (547) Returning Officers and 1698 Assistant Returning Officers were recruited and appointed for the fifty-seven (57) constituencies and the four hundred and ninety (490) polling districts. Four thousand, five hundred and seventy-six (4576) presiding officers and six thousand, eight hundred and sixty-four (6864) polling officers were recruited for the conduct of the elections.

Orientation workshops were conducted in all constituencies for the Returning and Assistant Returning Officers. They were guided through their responsibilities starting with nomination of candidates, through counting to declaration of results. The "Guide to Returning Officers in the Conduct of Elections" brochure and the Electoral Act were used as reference material.

Presiding Officers, Polling Officers, Police Officers and Polling Agents were also orientated on the polling process using the “Guide to Presiding Officers and Polling Officers in the Conduct of Elections” brochure.

## **VOTER REGISTRATION**

In accordance with section 5 of the Electoral Act, 2288 local polling stations and 26 external polling stations were established with the help of Party Liason Committees, Local Authorities and Botswana Embassies. For each registration period, 4576 registration officers were recruited from out of school youths and from the teaching fraternity and 133 supervisors were engaged to oversee the work of registration officers. These officers were trained on the registration procedures and electoral law requirements.

The Commission had set itself a target to register 650 000 voters by the time of going to the polls. The Commission conducted general voter registration in October 2007, in which 343 660 voters were registered. To increase the number of registered voters, three supplementary registration exercises were conducted between August 2008 and June 2009. In all these supplementary registration exercises, 382 157 voters were registered. At the end of all these efforts, a total of 725 817 Batswana were registered internally including 1646 who registered externally.

Although the Commission posted a record number of registered voters, human errors during voter registrations affected the validity of some voters' registration status. As a result some voters were unable to cast their vote on polling day. The Commission regrets such incidents and commits itself to prevent recurrence of such in future registration exercises.

## **PREPARATION OF ROLLS**

After every registration period, the registration forms were brought for data input into the database. This process was helped by the use of two Optical Mark Readers (OMR) Scanners. The OMR is dependent on bubbled form marks, which when not shaded will result in incomplete voter details. There were quite a number of cases where shading and recording of the information into voter registration form was erroneous. This slowed the process of rolls preparation.

The voters' rolls were published for public inspection in terms of Section 14, 15 and 16, for 42 days in the case of general registration and 21 days for supplementary registration. The rolls were then amalgamated into an election roll after the dissolution of Parliament in readiness for polling.

As a consequence of the lessons learnt during voter registration and preparation of the rolls the Commission intends to review the registration process.

## **LOGISTICS**

### Election Materials

The stock in hand of polling booths, ballot boxes and tents adequately covered both Parliamentary and Local Government 2009 General Elections.

### Lighting

The amendment of the electoral law which led to an increase in the number of counting centres, necessitated procurement of fluorescent lamps to augment the available stock of cadac lamps.

### Transport

Transport requirements were identified and requests made to Central Transport Organisation and Local Authorities for assistance. Where there was shortage, individual election officers were encouraged to use their personal vehicles and claim mileage. The vehicles were used for the distribution of election materials and transportation of personnel to various polling stations. Air transport was arranged in areas inaccessible by land.

### Basestock and Printing of Ballot Papers

The IEC in collaboration with the Government Printer procured the services of a United Kingdom company for the design and production of the base stock paper. Security features were incorporated in the design and manufacturing of the paper before it was shipped to the printer in South Africa for the printing of the ballot papers. Since the ballot papers were to be area specific, printing had to await the outcome of nomination of candidates on the 18th September 2009.

The biggest challenge in printing was the large number of Independent Candidates compared to 2004 General Elections. Consequently the Company had to print one hundred and twenty nine (129) different ballot paper permutations for Local Government, compared to twenty six (26) in 2004, and twenty two (22) for Parliamentary, compared to twelve (12) in 2004, which delayed and slowed the ballot paper printing.

### Distribution of Election Materials to Polling Stations

The election materials and ballot papers were packed according to polling stations for Local Government and Parliamentary elections. All the materials were collected by the 14<sup>th</sup> October 2009.

## **DISSOLUTION OF PARLIAMENT AND ISSUANCE OF WRITS OF ELECTIONS AND ELECTION INSTRUMENTS**

His Excellency the President dissolved the National Assembly with effect from 21st August 2009 and on the 3rd September 2009 he issued a Writ of Election for each of the 57 constituencies. In these Writs, the President appointed the 18th September 2009, and the 16th October 2009, as nomination and polling days respectively.

In terms of sections 154 (2) of the Electoral Act (cap 02:09), the Honourable Minister of Local Government issued 490 Election Instruments for the nomination and election of Local Government representatives. The Minister also appointed the 18th September 2009 and 16th October 2009 as nomination and polling days respectively.

## NOMINATIONS

### Presidential

In compliance with Section 7 (1) of the Presidential Elections (Supplementary Provisions) Act, the Secretary to the IEC appointed authenticating officers (Government Notice No.398 of 2009 in Government Gazette Vol XL VII, No. 46 dated 21st August 2009). These included District Commissioners, District Officers and Senior Police Officers.

The Chief Justice, as the Returning Officer for Presidential Elections, received nomination papers of the Presidential candidates on the 12<sup>th</sup> September 2009 between 1000 hours and 1300 hours, and between 1400 hours and 1700 hours at the High Court in Lobatse. At the close of business three (3) leaders of Political Parties were declared validly nominated as candidates for election to the Office of President as follows:-

### Parliamentary and Local Government

Parliamentary and Local Government nominations were held in terms of section 35 of the Electoral Act on the 18th September 2009 in all the fifty-seven (57) constituencies and four hundred and ninety (490) polling districts.

## ELECTION OBSERVERS

The 2009 General Elections attracted a lot of interest from both domestic and international observers. One thousand one hundred (1,100) observers observed the elections in most of the fifty-seven (57) constituencies.

The Commission held six (6) pre-election workshops in the country with the financial assistance from Friedrich Ebert Stiftung (FES) to orientate and familiarise domestic observers with the electoral legislation, Code of Conduct for Observers, and report writing techniques. International observers were also briefed together with both local and International Media on the election state of preparedness. The briefings were followed by their accreditation to facilitate access into polling stations and counting centres.

The Commission, for the first time, established a contact centre for ease of interaction with election observers and other stakeholders.

The participation of election observers remains a critical undertaking in a democracy to measure commitment of the Commission and that of the nation in upholding the principles of democracy. Their presence also demonstrates the Commission's commitment to maintaining credibility and transparency throughout the electoral process.

The Commission is awaiting feedback in the form of observers' reports and recommendations. In addition the Commission, with the assistance of the British High Commission and International IDEA, has constituted a performance audit team to assess its election state of preparedness and how it has fared in the conduct of the 2009 General Elections. The team's report is awaited. The recommendations from the reports together with those from evaluation workshops will be considered for possible implementation during the next General Elections.

## VOTING BY ELECTIONS AND POLICE OFFICERS

Section 61 of the Electoral Act requires the Secretary to the IEC to facilitate voting by polling officers and police officers who will be engaged at polling stations away from where they are registered to vote and are therefore unlikely to be able to vote on polling day.

This, according to the said section shall be not earlier than 15 days before the date fixed for the taking of the general poll. To fulfil the provisions of the above section this category of people were scheduled to vote on the 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2009 at all the fifty-seven (57) constituencies. On checking the ballot papers, it was discovered that the ballot papers for Local Government had some errors and could not be used. The Commission therefore met on the 28<sup>th</sup> September 2009 and decided to call off the poll. It was directed that this category of officers should be assisted by whatever means possible to vote on the 16<sup>th</sup> October 2009. To this end over a thousand elections officers were released from election duties to go to their respective destinations to cast their vote.

## **EXTERNAL VOTING**

In accordance with Section 5(3) of the Electoral Act, twenty-six (26) Polling Stations were established outside Botswana, the latest being in Malaysia. Eighteen (18) officers were appointed Returning Officers. These were Botswana Ambassadors, High Commissioners and Consular Generals in their countries of accreditation. At the polling stations 26 Members of the Embassy Staff were appointed Presiding Officers while other Batswana, mainly, students in those countries were appointed Polling Officers. Like their counterparts at home, they were trained on the electoral processes by officers from IEC Headquarters.

Botswana citizens residing outside the country voted on the 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2009. Upon completion of the voting, the ballot bags were sealed and brought back to Botswana by the respective Returning Officers. Political Parties, Observers and the Media were invited to witness the receiving and sorting of the ballots on the 8<sup>th</sup> October 2009.

The number of Batswana who voted abroad was 571 out of a total of 1644 who had registered to vote, representing 34.8% turnout. This is cause for concern considering the cost and logistical preparations involved.

## **POLLING DAY**

The general elections took place on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> October 2009. Most polling stations opened at 6:30 o'clock in the morning and closed at 7:00 O'clock in the evening. However in some instances where queues were long voters were allowed to vote until early hours of Saturday morning.

Polling staff in the delta were flown to and from their polling stations and the polling hours in the areas varied with that of the rest of the country. As flights in the delta stop at 6:00 O'clock in the evening, polling stations in the affected area were ordered to operate between 5:00 O'clock in the morning and 4:00 O'clock in the afternoon.

Generally the electorate had come to the polling stations in good numbers and took up queues, some as early as 5:00 O'clock in the morning. By and large Batswana continued to demonstrate patience and mutual respect during elections. There were no reported incidents of election related violence or intimidation.

There was however, an isolated incident where voting did not take place at Xohabe/Kumabaga polling station in the Malatswai polling district within the Serowe North West constituency.

A team consisting of two (2) Presiding Officers, four (4) Polling Officers, two (2) Police Officers and two (2) drivers was dispatched to the polling station to facilitate voting. The team failed to locate the polling station on two attempts despite a claim by one of the drivers that he knew the place. On the third attempt, now on polling day, after reporting to the constituency Returning Officer, the team failed again to pass through one farm as it was fenced and blocked the access road and by then it was already evening of polling day. The team ultimately gave in and went back.

The Returning Officers at both the constituency and polling district levels however, proceeded with counting and released the results following an instruction from the Commission.

The Xohabe/Kumabaga polling station had registered 16 voters for the 2009 general elections.

## COUNTING OF VOTES

In accordance with the amended section 69 (1) of the Electoral Act, after the closing of polls, all the National Assembly election ballot boxes in each constituency were transported to the counting centre of that constituency. The Local Government election ballot boxes in each polling district were transported to the counting centre of that polling district. Altogether there were 547 counting centres, 57 for constituencies and 490 for polling districts.

Present at the counting centres were the Returning Officers and their assistants, candidates, their spouses and their counting agents, observers and the media. Members of the public were also in attendance as permitted by the Returning Officers.

The law provides that ballot paper account of a polling station be verified as and when the ballot box of that polling station is received by the Returning Officer, but in some counting centres the process was not followed resulting in delay of counting. The Commission commits to ensure consistent application of electoral process.

## RESULTS

In the 2009 General Elections, 725, 817 voters registered. Out of this, a total of 555,308 voted. This represents a turnout of 76.51 percent of the total registered voters.

The Commission received the first results around 2100hrs on the 16<sup>th</sup> October 2009. The results continued to trickle in until the final results arrived on Saturday 17th October 2009.

Seven (7) Political parties and fifteen (15) Independent candidates contested the Parliamentary elections.

There was an equality of votes between the two leading candidates in Moshawana Polling District in Kgatleng West Constituency therefore a fresh election shall be held in terms of Section 76 of the Electoral Act.

The total number of rejected votes was 10,661, which translates into 1.92 percent of the total votes cast compared to 2.11 percent in 2004 General Elections. The rejections were mostly due to: a voter marking against more than one party, marks being made outside the appropriate boxes on the ballot papers and a voter not indicating their choice.

Botswana Democratic Party was returned unopposed in 3 polling districts in the Local Government Elections.

On Saturday evening 17th October 2009, the Chief Justice was informed that more than fifty percent of the Members of Parliament had declared their support for Lieutenant General Seretse Khama Ian Khama in the Presidential Election. The Chief Justice as the Returning Officer for the Presidential Election declared Lieutenant General Seretse Khama Ian Khama duly elected as President of the Republic of Botswana. The President took the oath of office on Tuesday 20th October 2009.

## EXPENDITURE

As preparing for election is a process spanning several years we have in the following table recorded actual recurrent expenditure for each financial year from 2005/2006 to 2009/2010 for appreciation. The amounts reflected under 2009/2010 are expenditures as at 23<sup>rd</sup> October, 2009. There are still more outstanding payments as the financial year has not ended yet.

The major activities concerning the 2009 General Elections were voter registration and the elections themselves. Both attracted payment of huge allowances to the officers involved. This explains the large difference between the personal emoluments for the 2008/2009 financial year (possibly 2009/2010 as well) and for the other years. The other big spenders were advertising and publicity and internal travelling to prepare for the elections.

## **LESSONS LEARNT DURING 2009 GENERAL ELECTIONS**

### **1. VOTER REGISTRATION**

- The Commission learnt that during registration of voters, some voters did not comply with the law on registration by either registering in constituencies/polling districts where they did not have residences or where they did not have their principal residences.
- The Commission observed that while the law provides for the removal of voters who registered unlawfully from the voters roll, it is silent on the action to be taken against aspirants of political office who encourage this unlawful activity.
- The Commission is of the view that it may be necessary to close up the gaps that appear in some sections of the law.

### **2. LONG QUEUES AT POLLING STATIONS**

- Long queues were rampant at most polling stations in cities, towns and big villages despite the Commission's decision to limit each polling station to have not more than 500 voters. This was cause for concern.
- The Commission had also committed to increasing booths where the numbers exceeded the limit. It is however apparent that long queues were as a result of several factors such as:
  - taking too long to identify names of voters on the roll
  - taking too long explaining the voting process to voters
  - not knowing which queue to stand in where there were more than one polling points at the same premises and;

- there being not enough signage to guide voters where to go.
- The Commission is of the view that some improvements can be made in the registration and voters roll management and intends to consult further on this.

### **3. ADVANCE POLLING**

- Section 61 of the Electoral Act provides for voting by elections and police officers who will be unable or likely to be unable to vote on the date of poll by reason of not having been assigned to the polling station in respect of which they are registered, to be allowed to vote not earlier than 15 days before the date fixed for taking of the poll.
- Voting by election officers and police officers must be revisited to ensure timeous logistical arrangements and avert any lapses.
- Consideration must be made to review the list of personnel who should be allowed to vote earlier to avoid any doubts as to who should be included in the list.
- The old and infirm took too long on the long queues; sometimes at the risk of their health or lives. Batswana will be implored to exercise BOTHO and allow them to vote without delay.

### **4. ENSURING SECRECY OF THE BALLOT FOR ALL**

- Though a template for the visually impaired was designed not many people used it.
- There are very few people who read and write in Braille. The template as is now, would be used by both those who can read Braille and those who cannot.

### **5. VOTERS NEEDING HELP TO ACCESS POLLING STATIONS**

- The commission has observed that mostl public places do not have wheelchair ramps and this will continue to be a nightmare for wheelchair bound voters to access polling stations.

### **6. USE OF UNDEVELOPED AND PRIVATE PROPERTY AS POLLING STATIONS**

- The Commission learnt with regret that many polling stations in urban areas and major villages are located in private properties and in undeveloped plots. This resulted with the use of tents and requirement of lighting facilities.

### **7. USE OF PUBLIC OFFICERS AS ELECTION OFFICERS**

- The Commission relies on the use of Public servants to run elections.
- There is no provision in the legal framework that specifically empowers the Secretary to the Commission to appoint public servants as election officers and retain them until the elections are over. There is need to look at this matter closely.

## **8. EXTERNAL VOTING**

- This legal requirement has so far proved not to be cost effective.
- Though democracy comes at a price a more cost effective way of allowing external voting must be explored.

## **9. EMBOSSED OR PERFORATED OFFICIAL MARK**

- This requirement complicates the printing process and limits the number of companies that bid for printing of ballot papers.
- This was intended to be a security feature.
- There is no provision in the legal framework that empowers the IEC to use any other security feature apart from those stated. A closer look at this is necessary.

## **10. REGISTRATION TRANSFERS**

- Though measures were put in place to minimize voter transfers they remained rampant across the country. A closer look at this practice is necessary.

## **CONCLUSION**

The 2009 General Elections came in the back drop of a number of major initiatives including: 2004 General Elections Audit report; 2004 Election evaluation workshop reports and the stakeholder's workshop which came up with recommendations that culminated in the improvement of the electoral processes and amendment of the law. Sixteen (16) sections of the Electoral Act were amended and of note worthy are the following sections:-

- 12 (8) which instituted determination of cut off date for registration of voters
- 25 (8) which debar transfers when a vacancy occurs, whether due to dissolution of Parliament, death of a candidate or resignation.
- 69 (1) which introduced separation of counting of votes for Parliament and Local Government elections.

The institution of these sections assisted the Commission to manage the electoral processes more efficiently.

The Commission also undertook to promulgate the "IEC Act" which will give IEC its persona and clear mandate. This Act is at the drafting stage.

During this interim period the Commission intensified its Civic and Voter Education activities and these efforts seemed to pay dividends as reflected in a number of achievements including the high voter registration and increased voter turn out on polling day.

The Commission has throughout the period continued to interact with its major stakeholders to foster effective collaboration that contributed to the improved participation of electorate in the electoral process.

The Local and International Observers in their preliminary reports gave the elections a clean bill pronouncing them free and fair.

The Commission will conduct evaluation workshops for officers who handled the process and will also consider the Audit report from Audit Consultants and Election Observers reports. The outcomes of the workshops and reports will assist in coming up with recommendations that will be further shared with the stakeholders to develop a plan of action to map the way forward to 2014 General Elections.

The Commission wishes to sincerely express its appreciation to its stakeholders, groups and individuals who contributed and participated in a variety of ways throughout the entire election process.





PARLIAMENTARY SEATS WON





PERCENTAGE OF SEATS OBTAINED BY CONTESTING







### PERCENTAGE REGISTERED BY AGE GROUP



### GENDER DISTRIBUTION OF REGISTERED VOTERS






